PhD, postdoc, associate professor, Department of Nordic Studies and Linguistics (NorS), Dialectology Section, University of Copenhagen,

Malene Monka's research combines dialectology and sociolinguistics. In her PhD thesis, Monka incorporates human geographic understandings of place into a socio-dialectologist framework in order to gain new insights on processes of dialect levelling in three Danish dialect areas. Monka's interest in dialect-leveling is further pursued in the two projects, *Language and Place* and *Dialects in the Periphery* that made up her postdoc. In the most recent project she is investigating language use and change in cities.

Monka is an experienced fieldworker; as a research assistant at the LANCHART Center, University of Copenhagen, and during her PhD and postdoc she has performed more than 250 sociolinguistic interviews and group interviews, designed and carried out language attitude tests, as well as ethnographic field work. She has trained and supervised groups of fieldworkers in Odder and Vinderup and has experience with planning transcriptions and coding of large sets of data.
