1. Results - overview

The aim of the project was to make versions of all Louis Hjelmslev's correspondence with other linguists as well as his unpublished works accessible in a net edition. The project has been carried out and completed as far as possible according to the plan originally devised.

The selection of texts belonging to Hjelmslev's own archive, exploited the survey already established before the project began by Lorenzo Cigana. From that original survey sprang the idea of the project description to enlarge the scope to include four other Danish linguists whose archives were surveyed by the project: HANS JØRGEN ULDALL (1907-1957), whose part in the development of the theory is taken as an established fact, although the exact extent of his impact up to now has never been clear; JENS HOLT (1904-1973), who played an important part in the dissemination of Glossematic thought in Denmark (and who left important papers to Aarhus University which have been included in the infrastructure thanks to meticulous work by Heidi McGhee); and finally ELI FISCHER-JØRGENSEN (1911-2010) and PAUL DIDERICHSEN (1905-1964), who each in their way confronted Hjelmslev's brand of linguistics with great challenges. We supplemented these rather voluminous archives with three smaller ones, viz. those left by FRANCIS J. WHITFIELD (1916-1996) (Hjelmslev's American translator and younger friend), HENNING SPANG-HANSEN (1920-2002), from the next generation of Danish linguists, and finally HARRY WETT FREDERIKSEN (1916-1974), who worked with the Hjelmslev theory almost all his life, first as a student and later as a collaborator. All of these linguists have been given due attention at the Project website:

The relevant texts in all these archives have been scanned for the project by the Royal Library. All the texts in the edition are available as scanned pictures of the original texts (facsimiles). In addition, we have carefully sifted through the documents and transcribed those correspondences which were essential for the understanding of Hjelmslev's oeuvre while not being fully penetrable by reading the facsimiles alone. This necessitated the development of a manual for transcription taylor-made for our purposes, a task which was successfully completed by Caroline Høglund Valentin Boolsen. For some of the papers it was possible to use OCR-recognized texts directly but most of them needed some edition. A framework for demonstration and commenting, available at glossematics.dk, was built by the Section of Language Technology at Department of Nordic Studies and Linguistics at the University of Copenhagen with Dorte Halstrup Hansen and Simon Gray as invaluable partners. They also facilitated the construction of a cross-reference system for persons and scientific concepts so that all individuals and concepts mentioned and identified are searchable.

The project collected permissions to publish the documents from all available heirs. In the case of infrastructuralism, permission was given to publish for research purposes. But the Royal Library by the same token got permission to publish in general and for a general public. Consequently, the Infrastructuralism website is protected by a wall and only available for individuals through the WAYF (Where Are You From) system connecting research institutions all over the world. No such protection is necessary for the publishing of the documents by the Royal Library at tekster.kb.dk.

A central device in the display framework is the time-line for Louis Hjelmslev's activities during his whole lifetime. This time-line, constructed by carefully searching through all available (including biographical) information by Viggo Bank Jensen, may be used as a key to the texts in the edition. It visualizes all retrievable activities in Hjelmslev's biography: publications, teachings and travels, and makes it possible to locate a given letter in its context.

Besides this, the texts are accessible through a number of other ways in the infrastructure. Important letter conversations between e.g. Hjelmslev and Roman Jakobson, Hjelmslev and Eli Fischer-Jørgensen, Hjelmslev and Uldall etc etc are available through direct links, and there are other, more conventional ways to access the material. In the course of the process, the bibliographies of the main participants were brought up to date and included, thus providing another, more conventional way to access the material. They are accessible both through our 'gated' website and through the public project website, which was first housed at the Aarhus University website, and now is accessible on the Copenhagen University website.

3. Scientific and public dissemination

In the course of the project, a number of dissemination activities have been undertaken. The total number of contributions is found in the lists of publications and lectures from the participants annexed to this report. We would like to mention a couple of important activities.

The first of these activities was the book *Structuralism as one – structuralism as many: Studies in Structuralisms*, edited by Lorenzo Cigana and Frans Gregersen and containing papers by (among others) Kirsten Hastrup, Finn Collin, Frederik Stjernfelt, Frederick Newmeyer, John Josephs, Peter Harder, Hans Basbøll and Sémir Badir. Originally planned as a conference (which could not be held due to the Covid 19 pandemic), the idea of the book was to demonstrate the widely differing interpretations of the concept of structuralism, thereby shedding light on the specific approaches envisaged by Louis Hjelmslev and Hans Jørgen Uldall.

The PI's and the Post. Doc's of the project were all present at the large traditional conference on the History of Linguistics, ICHOLS, which was held under the auspices of the Università Cattolica de Sacra Cuore in Milano in august 2021. Unfortunately, the pandemic forced this event to be an internet-based event, thereby preventing many of the interesting international contacts that conferences otherwise lead to. All four members read papers at the conference, and Cigana and Jørgensen organized a workshop, the papers of which are soon going to be the basis for a special issue of *Acta linguistica hafniensia* on the concept of ‘Gesamtbedeutungen’, a concept from the speculative grammar of the early 19th century revived (albeit in different ways) by the earliest structuralists (Jakobson and Hjelmslev).

For the next ICHOLS in Georgia 2024 we plan another workshop in continuation of the subject of the project.

Post doc Lorenzo Cigana has been affiliated with the University of Liège both before and during his leave of absence during the project. It was thus possible for him to use the excellent facilities here to organize a conference together with the leading international specialist on Hjelmslev and semiotics, professor Sémir Badir on ‘Facets of structural thinking, Reasons and Methods of a Rediscovery’. The symposium took place 27-28.4 2022. It featured among others three presentations from the project (Gregersen, Cigana and Jørgensen).

As the final effort to celebrate the development and availability of the infrastructure, the project organized a symposium which we entitled ‘Rebooting Glossematics’ in order to highlight one of the main purposes of the project, viz. to show how much of the work of the Danish structuralists is actually still relevant for today’s linguistics. This symposium, which was made possible by a generous grant from the Ulla and Børge Andersen foundation, took place at the Royal Academy and the University of Copenhagen 29.-30.11 2022. 4. Parallel and collaborating editorial projects

Already before the infrastructuralism project, The Carlsberg foundation and the Royal Academy made the publishing and annotation of the correspondence between Eli Fischer-

Jørgensen and Roman Jakobson possible. Viggo Bank Jensen was essential for this project and brought with him his unique knowledge of all the structuralists into the new project.

As mentioned above, the Royal Library has decided to publish a number of documents from the Hjelmslev archives on their website tekster.kb.dk. The material here is accessible without limitations, but the commenting, the transcriptions and the special infrastructure is only accessible through the website of the project.

The Linguistic Circle of Copenhagen decided to publish Hjelmslev's printed works, as far as their copyright reached. Through the benevolence of the Learned Society at the University of Aarhus, who owned the copyright of the important book *La catégorie de cas* (1935-7), it has now been possible to get web access to all important articles on linguistic matters that Hjelmslev ever wrote.

The last and maybe most challenging parallel project is the edition of Hjelmslev's important 1942-3 lectures on 'Linguistic Theory'. Often alluded to, but until now only accessible in more or less messy manuscripts of varying authority, the lectures will be published as a book in Danish and in a web version in English. The English version builds on a partial translation by Francis J. Whitfield, Hjelmslev's friend and main translator into English. Heidi McGhee from our project, who is bilingual Danish/English, has assisted with the translation of missing passages.

In this way, the project has contributed to a larger wave of actions to make the contributions of the Copenhagen Circle better known.

5. What is the use of the edition?

The edition of the letters and the intensified work with the problems has proved itself useful in connection with another project, in which the PI of this project was a participant, namely a Marie Curie project "What makes Danish sound so difficult?" (Horizon 2020 Part I Excellent Science MSCA 34620) carried out by Camilla Søballe Horslund and myself with strong support from Rasmus Puggaard-Rode. In the critical revision of the current structural analysis of Danish stop consonants and the possible phonemic interpretation(s) of them, the access to the letters between especially Hjelmslev and Uldall proved invaluable in connection with the understanding of the motives of the analysis given by these two front figures of the Glossematic movement in papers from 1936 (Uldall) and 1949/1951 (Hjelmslev). After having treated the problems in a synchronic analysis, the project continued in two directions: a historical direction, attempting a revision of the chains of causations between the sound development, and a methodological direction, attempting a more thorough analysis of the motives for the analyses given. In the latter connection, the letters gave invaluable testimony to the way the discussions between Hjelmslev and Uldall developed. Especially important is the testimony in the letters that the analytic problems in the glossematic treatment of the stop consonants is actually much tighter woven than it would appear from the immediate reading the two papers.

The experience with this project demonstrates that the letters, besides their invaluable historical value, may also provide insights in synchronic hard-core analytic matters.
